SUMMARY PROCEEDING ORDER

NOW, on this 31 day of August, 2022, the above-captioned matter comes before the Complaint Review Committee of the Kansas Behavioral Sciences Regulatory Board (Board).

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Board finds that the following facts have been established by a preponderance of the evidence:

- 1. Jennifer M. Keane ("Respondent") was at all times relevant, a Licensed Master Social Worker ("LMSW"), having been issued LMSW License No. 5105. This license expires on July 31, 2023. Respondent is currently, and was at all times relevant an LMSW within the meaning of the laws relating to regulation of social workers, K.S.A. 65-6301 et seq.
- 2. On or about March 11, 2022, the Board received a Report of Alleged Violation ("RAV") alleging Respondent may have violated certain statues and regulations governing the practice of licensed master social workers in the State of Kansas.

- 3. A family, a mother and minor child, were living with Respondent. Respondent was not providing professional services to these individuals.
- 4. However, Respondent allowed this mother to use Respondent's vehicle during the time that this mother was residing with Respondent. Respondent found a drug pipe in the vehicle after this mother used Respondent's car.
- 5. Respondent provided a response to the Board related to this RAV. In her response, Respondent reported she did have concerns about this mother's mental health. Further, that Respondent was concerned this mother was using methamphetamine in Respondent's car.
- 6. Respondent did not report her concerns to law enforcement or the Kansas Department for Children and Families despite knowing a minor child resided with this mother.

APPLICABLE LAW

- 7. Pursuant to K.S.A. 77-537(a) of the Kansas Administrative Procedure Act ("KAPA"), a state agency may use summary proceedings, subject to a party's request for a hearing on the order, if:
 - (1) The use of those proceedings in the circumstances does not violate any provision of law;
 - (2) the protection of the public interest does not require the state agency to give notice and an opportunity to participate to persons other than the parties;
 - (3) based upon an investigation of the facts by the state agency, beyond receipt of the allegations, the state agency believes in good faith that the allegations will be supported to the applicable standard of proof, provided however that an alleged failure to meet the standards set forth in this subsection shall not be subject to immediate judicial review and shall not invalidate any later agency action that has been supported to the applicable standard of proof; and
 - (4) the order does not take effect until after the time for requesting a hearing has expired.
- 8. Pursuant to K.S.A. 65-6302(b): "Social work practice" means the professional activity of helping individuals, groups or communities enhance or restore their capacity for physical, social and economic functioning and the professional application of social work values,

principles and techniques in areas such as psychotherapy, social service administration, social planning, social work consultation and social work research to one or more of the following ends: Helping people obtain tangible services; counseling with individuals, families and groups; helping communities or groups provide or improve social and health services; and participating in relevant social action. The practice of social work requires knowledge of human development and behavior; of social, economic and cultural institutions and forces; and of the interaction of all these factors. Social work practice includes the teaching of practicum courses in social work and includes the diagnosis and treatment of mental disorders as authorized under K.S.A. 65-6306 and 65-6319, and amendments thereto.

- 9. K.S.A. 65-6311(a)(9): The board may refuse to issue, renew or reinstate a license, may condition, limit, revoke or suspend a license, may publicly or privately censure a licensee or may impose a fine not to exceed \$1,000 per violation upon a finding that a licensee or an applicant for license has been found to have engaged in unprofessional conduct as defined by applicable rules and regulations adopted by the Board. Specifically, K.A.R. 102-2-7(j): offering to perform or performing services clearly inconsistent or incommensurate with one's training, education, and experience and with accepted professional standards for social work.
- 10. K.S.A. 38-2223(a)(1)(B): When any of the following persons has reason to suspect that a child has been harmed as a result of physical, mental or emotional abuse or neglect or sexual abuse, the person shall report the matter promptly ... the following persons licensed by the state to provide mental health services: Licensed psychologists, licensed masters level psychologists, licensed clinical psychotherapists, licensed social workers, licensed marriage and family therapists, licensed clinical marriage and family therapists, licensed behavioral analysts, licensed assistant behavioral analysts, licensed professional counselors, licensed clinical professional counselors and registered alcohol and drug abuse counselors.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

11. Respondent finds that Respondent was in violation of K.S.A. 65-6311(a)(9), as defined in K.A.R. 102-2-7(j), in that Respondent is a mandatory reporter under K.S.A. 38-2223(a)(1)(B), and she failed to report her concerns that the mother of a minor child residing with Respondent may be using methamphetamine, which is incommensurate with the accepted standards for social work.

ORDER

WHEREFORE, based on the above Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law and pursuant to the authority granted by K.S.A. 65-6311(a) and K.S.A. 77-537, the Complaint Review Committee of behalf of the Board finds that the Kansas LMSW license of Respondent Jennifer M. Keane should be and is hereby PUBLICALLY CENSORED for her violations of the Kansas Social Workers Licensure Act.
