CONSENT AGREEMENT AND FINAL ORDER

NOW on this 27 day of February, 2018[?], the above-captioned matter comes before the Kansas Behavioral Sciences Regulatory Board ("Board") by and through Assistant Attorney General Jane E. Weiler on behalf of the Board, and by agreement of Karina Wallace, ("Licensee"), for the purposes of resolving the above-captioned matter.

The parties knowingly and voluntarily agree as follows:

1. On June 22, 2015, the Board issued Licensee an original Licensed Master Social Worker ("LMSW") No. 9665. This license expires on June 30, 2019. Licensee is currently, and was at all times relevant to this Consent Agreement and Final Order, an LMSW within the meaning of the laws relating to regulation of social workers, K.S.A. 65-6301 *et seq.*

CASE NO. 18-MS-0121

2. On or about February 8, 2018, a Report of Alleged Violation was received by the Board alleging Licensee may have violated certain statutes and regulations governing the practice of master's level social workers in the State of Kansas.

3. Licensee was employed at the University of Kansas Health Systems as a social worker.

4. In July 2017, Licensee provided services to a sixteen (16) year-old patient. This patient was receiving chemotherapy related to a diagnosis of cancer.

5. In October 2017, the patient had his arm amputated due to the cancer. Following his discharge from the hospital, Licensee began sharing Snapchat messages outside of his hospital admissions. Initially, the Snapchat messages consisted primarily of just the exchange of humorous pictures.

6. In mid-November 2017, Licensee and the patient began to communicate more often via Snapchat, and these messages included flirtations between Licensee and the patient. Additionally, the patient would follow Licensee around the common areas of the hospital and they would spend time together.

7. In December 2017, the patient stopped communicating with Licensee, and he blocked her from Snapchat.

8. In January 2017, Licensee did go to the patient's hospital room and expressed to him an emotional attachment during this conversation.

9. The patient reported his relationship with Licensee to someone at the hospital.

10. On or about February 2, 2018, Licensee was terminated from University of Kansas Health Systems related to this incident. Licensee failed to report to the Board that she was terminated from employment related to malfeasance.

APPLICABLE LAW

11. K.S.A. 65-6302(b): "Social work practice" means the professional activity of helping individuals, groups or communities enhance or restore their capacity for physical, social and economic functioning and the professional application of social work values, principles and techniques in areas such as psychotherapy, social service administration, social planning, social work consultation and social work research to one or more of the following ends: Helping people obtain tangible services; counseling with individuals, families and groups; helping communities or groups provide or improve social and health services; and participating in relevant social action. The practice of social work requires knowledge of human development and behavior; of social, economic and cultural institutions and forces; and of the interaction of all these factors. Social work practice includes the teaching of practicum courses in social work and includes the diagnosis and treatment of mental disorders as authorized under K.S.A. 65-6306 and 65-6319, and amendments thereto.

12. K.S.A. 65-6311(a)(9): The board may refuse to issue, renew or reinstate a license, may condition, limit, revoke or suspend a license, may publicly or privately censure a licensee or may impose a fine not to exceed \$1,000 per violation upon a

finding that a licensee or an applicant for license has been found to have engaged in unprofessional conduct as defined by applicable rules and regulations adopted by the Board. Specifically:

- a. K.A.R. 102-2-7(b)(3): has been demoted, terminated, suspended, reassigned, or asked to resign from employment, or has resigned from employment for some form of misfeasance, malfeasance, or nonfeasance.
- b. K.A.R. 102-2-7(j): offering to perform or performing services clearly inconsistent or incommensurate with one's training, education, or experience with accepted professional standards for social work.
- c. K.A.R. 102-2-7(tt): engaging in a dual relationship with a client, supervisee, or student.

13. Licensee and the Board mutually desire to enter into this Consent Agreement and Final Order in lieu of further summary and adjudicative proceedings.

14. Licensee understands that by entering into this Consent Agreement and Final Order Licensee waives all rights to further adjudication of facts and law that could be determined pursuant to summary proceedings or a hearing conducted in accordance with the Kansas Administrative Procedures Act, K.S.A. 77-501 *et seq.* in relation to Case No. 18-MS-0121.

15. Licensee waives the right to file a motion for reconsideration and all rights of appeal pursuant to the Kansas Act for Judicial Review, K.S.A. 77-601 *et seq.* in relation to Case No. 18-MS-0121.

16. The Board accepts Licensee's waiver of rights and stipulations.

ORDER

WHEREFORE, the Board finds that the above facts have been established by clear and convincing evidence; and further finds that Licensee was in violation of K.S.A. 65-6311(a)(9), as defined in K.A.R. 102-2-7(b)(3), in that Licensee was terminated from University of Kansas Health Systems related to malfeasance.

Additionally, the Board finds Licensee was in violation of K.S.A. 65-6311(a)(9), as defined in K.A.R. 102-2-7(j) and K.A.R. 102-2-7(tt), in that Licensee performed services clearly inconsistent or incommensurate with one's training, education or experience or with accepted professional standards. And she engaged in a dual relationship with her client when she developed a friendship outside of her clinical role with a client. This friendship included Licensee expressing to this client an emotional attachment.

AND WHEREAS Licensee and the Board mutually desire to enter into a Consent Agreement and Final Order in lieu of further adjudicative proceedings to resolve the reported violations.

NOW THEREFORE, Licensee consents to the following terms and conditions, and the Board orders that:

17. Licensee shall practice only under individual supervision by an independent clinical-level supervisor to be approved by the Board. Licensee shall have a one (1) hour face to face meeting at least every two (2) weeks with her supervisor. There shall be no dual relationship with the supervisor.

18. Licensee shall provide a copy of this Consent Agreement to the supervisor and authorize the supervisor to provide written quarterly reports to the Board's Investigator for one (1) year term of supervision. These quarterly reports shall be due by March 1, 2019, June 1, 2019, September 1, 2019, and December 1, 2019.

19. Licensee must notify the Board's Investigator within ten (10) days of a change in her employment and/or address change.

20. Licensee shall be responsible for any costs and expenses incurred in satisfying the terms of this Consent Agreement and Final Order.

21. Additionally, Licensee shall obtain three (3) extra continuing education hours in Ethics beyond the biennial requirement, taken in-person or on-line within three (3) months of the effective date of this Consent Agreement and Final Order. These additional continuing education hours shall include, but not limited to, boundaries and dual relationships.

22. These hours shall be in addition to those continuing education hours required for renewal of license.

23. All foreseen and unforeseen expenses to complete the aforementioned course(s) including travel, lodging, program fee, meals, etc., shall be at Licensee's own expense.

24. Licensee shall all submit to the Board's investigator at its offices located at 700 SW Harrison St, Suite 420, Topeka, Kansas, 66603, any and all documents evidencing compliance with the terms and conditions required by this Consent Agreement and Final Order.

25. After completion of the actions set out in the Consent Agreement and Final Order, Licensee will have no remaining obligations to the Board in relation to this case. However, Licensee may be subject to further enforcement action if Licensee

fails to comply with the terms, conditions, and requirements imposed by this Consent Agreement and Final Order.

26. The matters referred to in this Consent Agreement and Final Order shall not be grounds for future action against Licensee, except the extent that that such matters may be relevant for future disciplinary or licensure proceedings in the Board's consideration of the factors identified in K.S.A. 65-6313 [Licenses; effective and expiration dates; renewal; continuing education; safety awareness training; reinstatement; duplicate; notice of change of address], and K.S.A. 65-6311 [Grounds for suspension, limitation, condition revocation or refusal to issue or renew license; procedure; licensure of applicant with felony conviction, requirements], for establishing rehabilitation or a pattern of conduct.

27. Except as provided in paragraph 26, this Consent Agreement and Final Order shall operate as a complete release of all claims the parties may have against each other pending before the Board and arising out of the Board's investigation of these matters. Licensee agrees not to file, or cause to be filed, any litigation or claims in any federal or state court of law or federal or state administrative agency against the Board, its agents, Board members, or employees, individually or in their official capacity. Such litigation or claims include, but are not limited to, any K.S.A. Chapter 60 or Chapter 61 civil action regarding negligence and/or a 42 United States Code action and/or any administrative petition for redress. Licensee agrees that all actions in this matter were a bona fide use of administrative discretion on the part of the Board, its members, and employees, which is a statutory exception to liability within the Kansas Tort Claims Act, K.S.A. 75-6104(b), (c) or (e).

28. Licensee agrees that this Consent Agreement and Final Order conforms to Kansas and federal law and that the Board has jurisdiction to enter into it and enter the Final Order provided for herein.

29. Licensee understands that a notification of this Consent Agreement and Final Order shall be provided to any other state licensing board or entity if Licensee is also licensed, registered or certified in another state.

30. This Consent Agreement and Final Order shall be a public record in the custody of the Board.



32. This Consent Agreement and Final Order shall become effective on the date indicated in the Certificate of Service.


