Summary Proceeding Order of Revocation

Now on this 23 day of June, 2025, the above-captioned matter comes before the Complaint Review Committee of the Kansas Behavioral Sciences Regulatory Board (the "Board"). After reviewing its administrative records and otherwise being duly advised in the premises, the Board makes the following findings of fact, conclusions of law, and orders.

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. The Board is the duly constituted and acting agency of the State of Kansas authorized to administer and enforce the provisions of the Kansas Social Work Licensure Act, K.S.A. 65-6301, *et. seq.*, and amendments thereto (the "Act").

2. Respondent Dennis J. Cook ("Respondent") is an individual with a last known preferred mailing address on file with the Board of [REDACTED]. At all times relevant hereto, Respondent has been licensed as a Master's Social Worker (LMSW) within the meaning of the Act.

3. On August 5, 2023, the Board entered a Summary Proceeding Order which in relevant part found that Respondent engaged in unprofessional conduct as defined in K.A.R. 102-2-7(b)(3) for failure to notify the Board within a reasonable period of time of being terminated from employment for some form of misfeasance, malfeasance or nonfeasance, and as defined in K.A.R. 102-2-7(j) for performing professional services clearly inconsistent with his training, education and experience and with accepted professional standards, including providing a book containing pornographic images to two (2) male youths who were inmates within a juvenile detention facility, and concealing or attempting to conceal the same from the juvenile detention facility security (hereafter "Summary Proceeding Order"). A true and correct copy of the Summary Proceeding Order is attached hereto as Exhibit A and incorporated herein by reference as if fully set forth herein.

4. The Summary Proceeding Order became a final order of the Board on September 25, 2023. See Exhibit A at pp. 5 and 6.

5. The Summary Proceeding Order suspended Respondent's LMSW license until further order of the Board. Moreover, the Summary Proceeding Order ordered Respondent to undergo a fitness for duty evaluation within 180 days of the effective date of the Summary Proceeding Order and cause the Board to receive a copy of the report issued following the fitness for duty evaluation. See *id.* at pp. 3 and 4.

6. As of the date of this Summary Order of Revocation, Respondent has not caused the Board to receive proof of completion of a fitness for duty evaluation, or a copy of any report issued following completion of a fitness for duty evaluation.

7. In addition, Respondent is subject to a Consent Agreement and Final Order entered on December 20, 2022 in case no. 22-MS-0129, through which in relevant part, Respondent was to complete and practice under one (1) year of supervision and cause the Board to receive quarterly written reports evidencing completion of supervision. Respondent's LMSW license was suspended pursuant to the Summary Proceeding Order prior to Respondent completing the required supervision.

8. Finally, on or about April 26, 2023, the Board received a complaint against Respondent, docketed as 23-MS-0161. No disposition of case 23-MS-0161 occurred given that Respondent's LMSW license was suspended pursuant to the Summary Proceeding Order.

APPLICABLE LAW

9. The Act authorizes the Board to condition, limit, revoke or suspend a license as a master social worker, and/or publicly or privately censure a licensee or impose a fine not to exceed \$1,000 per violation upon a finding that a licensee violates any provision of K.S.A. 65-6311(a)(1) – (11).

10. K.S.A. 65-6311(a)(11) provides in relevant part that the board may condition, limit, revoke or suspend a license, publicly or privately censure a licensee or may impose a fine not to exceed \$1,000 per violation upon a finding that a licensee:

(11) has violated any lawful order or directive of the board previously entered by the board;

11. Pursuant to K.S.A. 77-537(a) of the Kansas Administrative Procedure Act ("KAPA"), a state agency may use summary proceedings, subject to a party's request for a hearing on the order, if:

(1) The use of those proceedings in the circumstances does not violate any provision of law;

- (2) the protection of the public interest does not require the state agency to give notice and an opportunity to participate to the persons other than the parties;
- (3) based upon an investigation of the facts by the state agency, beyond receipt of the allegations, the state agency believes in good faith that the allegations will be supported to the applicable standard of proof, provided however that an alleged failure to meet the standard set forth in this subsection shall not be subject to immediate judicial review and shall not invalidate any later agency action that has been supported to the applicable standard of proof; and
- (4) the order does not take effect until after the time for requesting a hearing has expired.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

12. The use of summary proceedings pursuant to KAPA is appropriate in this case.
13. Applicant is in violation of K.S.A. 65-6311(a)(11) for failure to complete the fitness for duty evaluation and provide proof of the same to the Board as required by the Summary Proceeding Order. The Summary Proceeding Order is a final order of the Board and constitutes the lawful order of the Board pursuant to the Act and KAPA.
14. The Board reserves the right to find additional violation(s) and/or take additional action against Respondent related to any future fitness for duty evaluation completed by Respondent, in conjunction with the Consent Agreement and Final Order entered in case no. 22-MS-0129, in conjunction with the pending investigation in case no. 23-MS-0161, or based upon any additional information which may become known by the Board.

SANCTION

WHEREFORE, in consideration of the above findings of fact and conclusions of law, and pursuant to the authority granted by K.S.A. 65-6311(a) and K.S.A. 77-537, the Complaint Review Committee on behalf of the Board hereby finds and orders that:

- A. Respondent's LMSW License No.11608 should be and is hereby REVOKED effective as of the date this Summary Proceeding Order of Revocation becomes a final order of the Board. Respondent's LMSW license shall remain revoked until further order of the Board and shall not be reinstated prior to the expiration of a period of five (5) years from the effective date of this Summary Proceeding Order of Revocation, provided, that such five (5) year period shall not be construed as a presumption, implication, indication or otherwise that Respondent shall merit reinstatement after expiration of such period of revocation; and
- B. If and when Respondent seeks reinstatement of his LMSW license from the Board, Respondent shall cause the Board to receive the information and items required by K.A.R. 102-2-11(h) and shall bear the burden of making the showing required by K.A.R. 102-2-11(h)(4) as in effect on the effective date of this Summary Order of

Revocation, as well as satisfying any outstanding matter required by the Consent Agreement and Final Order entered in case no. 22-MS-0129, the Summary Proceeding Order and responding to the allegations of case no. 23-MS-0161, all of which are expressly reserved by the Board for future determination.

IT IS SO ORDERED.

NOTICE OF ADMINISTRATIVE RELIEF

In the event that you do not timely request a hearing, the above Order will become a final order the day following the 18th day referenced above (i.e., 19 calendar days following the date listed in the Certificate of Service below). Pursuant to K.S.A 77-529, a party may file with the Board a petition for reconsideration within 15 days from the date the Summary Proceeding Order becomes a final order. Such petition must state the specific grounds upon which relief is requested. The filing of a petition for reconsideration is not a prerequisite for seeking judicial review.

Pursuant to K.S.A. 77-528, a party may file, if applicable, a petition for stay of effectiveness of the order prior to the expiration of the time in which to file a petition for judicial review. The filing of a petition for a stay of effectiveness is not a prerequisite for seeking judicial review.

NOTICE OF JUDICIAL RELIEF

If a petition for reconsideration is not filed pursuant to K.S.A. 77-613, a party may file within 30 days from the date the Summary Proceeding Order becomes a final order a petition for judicial review with the appropriate district court as provided in the Kansas Judicial Review Act, K.S.A. 77-601 *et seq.*

Summary Proceeding Order

Now on this 28th day of August, 2023, the above-captioned matter comes before the Complaint Review Committee of the Kansas Behavioral Sciences Regulatory Board (the "Board"). After reviewing its administrative records and otherwise being duly advised in the premises, the Board makes the following findings of fact, conclusions of law, and orders.

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. The Board is the duly constituted and acting agency of the State of Kansas authorized to administer and enforce the provisions of the Kansas Social Work Licensure Act, K.S.A. 65-6301, *et. seq.*, and amendments thereto (the "Act").

2. Respondent Dennis J. Cook's ("Respondent") is an individual with a last known preferred mailing address on file with the Board of [REDACTED]. At all times relevant hereto, Respondent has been licensed as a Master's Social Worker (LMSW) within the meaning of the Act.

3. On or about February 2, 2023, the Board received a complaint against Respondent which alleged in relevant part that Respondent admitted to providing his personal book identified as " Won ABC Colourkamikaze Edition Kunst Der Comics," containing pornographic images to two (2) youth males on two (2) different occasions at the Juvenile Detention Facility in Wichita, Kansas. Respondent provided the books to the two (2) different youth males on February 1, 2023 and February 2, 2023.

4. The complainant further asserted that video footage showed Respondent concealing the book from the JDF facility security, and that while he was not allowed in the JDF by himself, video footage showed that he slipped the book under the door to the youth without an escort.

5. The complaint was provided to Respondent for response. Through his response received on or about May 2, 2023, Respondent admitted that he provided the book in question to two (2) youth males in the JDF and denied that it contained pornography, but at the same time, represented that he has no inclination to argue about what pornography is or whether the images in the book constitute pornography.

6. Respondent expressed regret relating to incident, because he was terminated from his employment. However, Respondent represented that he does not regret providing the book in question to the two (2) youth males in the JDF.

7. Furthermore, Respondent revealed through his response that his employment was terminated due to the incident on February 4, 2023.

APPLICABLE LAW

8. The Act authorizes the Board to condition, limit, revoke or suspend a license as a master social worker, and/or publicly or privately censure a licensee or impose a fine not to exceed \$1,000 per violation upon a finding that a licensee violates any provision of K.S.A. 65-6311(a)(1) – (11).

9. K.S.A. 65-6311(a)(9) provides in relevant part that the board may condition, limit, revoke or suspend a license, publicly or privately censure a licensee or may impose a fine not to exceed \$1,000 per violation upon a finding that a licensee:

(10) has been found to have engaged in unprofessional conduct as defined by applicable rules and regulations adopted by the board;

10. K.A.R. 102-2-7 provides in relevant part that any of the following acts by a licensee shall constitute unprofessional conduct:

(b) except when the information has been obtained in the context of a confidential relationship, failing to notify the board, within a reasonable period of time, that any of the following conditions apply to any person regulated by the board or applying for a license or registration, including oneself:

.....

(3) has been demoted, terminated, suspended, reassigned, or asked to resign from employment, or has resigned from employment, for some form of misfeasance, malfeasance, or nonfeasance;

.....

(j) offering to perform or performing services clearly inconsistent or incommensurate with one's training, education, and experience and with accepted professional standards for social work;

11. Pursuant to K.S.A. 77-537(a) of the Kansas Administrative Procedure Act ("KAPA"), a state agency may use summary proceedings, subject to a party's request for a hearing on the order, if:

- (1) The use of those proceedings in the circumstances does not violate any provision of law;
- (2) the protection of the public interest does not require the state agency to give notice and an opportunity to participate to the persons other than the parties;
- (3) based upon an investigation of the facts by the state agency, beyond receipt of the allegations, the state agency believes in good faith that the allegations will be supported to the applicable standard of proof, provided however that an alleged failure to meet the standard set forth in this subsection shall not be subject to immediate judicial review and shall not invalidate any later agency action that has been supported to the applicable standard of proof; and
- (4) the order does not take effect until after the time for requesting a hearing has expired.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

12. The use of summary proceedings pursuant to KAPA is appropriate in this case.

13. Applicant is in violation of K.S.A. 65-6311(a)(9), in that Applicant has engaged in unprofessional conduct as defined in K.A.R. 102-2-7(b)(3) through failing to notify the Board within a reasonable period of time of being terminated from employment from some form of misfeasance, malfeasance or nonfeasance. Respondent did not inform the Board of his termination until approximately three (3) months after it occurred.

14. Furthermore, Applicant is in violation of K.S.A. 65-6311(a)(9), in that Applicant has engaged in unprofessional conduct as defined in K.A.R. 102-2-7(j) through performing services clearly inconsistent with his training, education, and experience and with accepted professional standards for social work, to include not only providing the book in question to the two (2) male youth, but concealing or attempting to conceal the same from JDF personnel.

SANCTION

WHEREFORE, in consideration of the above findings of fact and conclusions of law, and pursuant to the authority granted by K.S.A. 65-6311(a) and K.S.A. 77-537, the Complaint Review Committee on behalf of the Board hereby finds and orders that:


- A. Respondent's LMSW License No.11608 should be and is hereby **SUSPENDED** effective as of the date this Summary Proceeding Order becomes a final order of the Board, and until further order of the Board;
- B. Respondent shall complete a fitness for duty evaluation by an evaluator within one hundred eighty (180) days of the effective date of this Summary

Proceeding Order. The evaluator must be approved in advance by the Board in writing. Respondent shall bear all costs in connection with the evaluation;

- C. Respondent shall cause the Board to receive a copy of the report issued in conjunction with the fitness for duty evaluation; and
- D. The Complaint Review Committee will review the results of the fitness for duty evaluation and may consider further action based on those results; provided, however, that in any subsequent action Respondent will be provided with notice and an opportunity to respond in accordance with the Act and KAPA.

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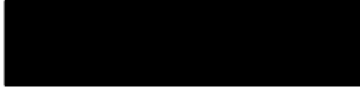


