- I. Call to Order.** The meeting was called to order by David Anderson, Chair of the Advisory Committee, at 1:00 p.m.

Master's Level Psychology Advisory Committee Members. Advisory Committee Members who participated by Zoom or phone were David Anderson, David Stevens, Elizabeth Burch, Ginger Hill, Rebecca Jabara, Lauren Lucht, Sarah McMillen, Iris Pauly, Robert Pedroza, Katelynn Reed, Jennifer Schreiner, and Joshua Tanguay. - VI. New Business**
- A. **Advisory Committee Membership.** Four Advisory Committee members have terms ending at the end of June 2026. Two of these Advisory Committee members have chosen to seek reappointment (Sarah McMillen and Iris Pauly), while two members are not seeking reappointment (Ginger Hill and Joshua Tanguay). Therefore, there will be two openings on the Advisory Committee. Applications will be gathered from LMLPs and LCPs who have interest in serving on the Advisory Committee, and those applications will be brought to the next Advisory Committee meeting for discussion on recommendations for new members. The Advisory Committee Chair recognized Ginger Hill and Joshua Tanguay for their time served on the Advisory Committee.
 - B. **Overview of BSRB Investigative and Disciplinary Processes and Discussions on Common Complaints Against Master's Level Psychologists and Licensed Clinical Psychotherapists.** The Executive Director provided Advisory

Committee members with an overview of the BSRB investigative and disciplinary processes and provided them with the topics for common complaints against Master's Level Psychologists and Licensed Clinical Psychotherapists. Between fiscal year 2020 and fiscal year 2025, the BSRB received a total of 158 complaints against practitioners in the Master's Level Psychology profession. Common reports of alleged violations for the profession in 2025 centered around dual relationships, confidentiality, complaints regarding foster care/custody/divorce evaluations, and performing services inconsistent with one's training, education, experience, or accepted professional standards.

C. Discussion on Revised EPPP Licensing Examination Timeline Update and Proposed Increase by ASPPB Board. The Board for ASPPB recently voted to increase the price of the EPPP examination from \$600 to \$650, effective April 1, 2028, with a biannual increase formed by the consumer price index (CPI) beginning on April 1, 2030. Advisory Committee members expressed concerns, as the EPPP already costs more than any other BSRB professions' licensing examinations. The Executive Director said that he would express the Advisory Committee's opposition to these fee increases at the midyear ASPPB meeting, ask questions related to the reasons for these increases, and gauge the positions of other members of the association.

D. Discussion on Possible Licensing Examination for Master's Level Psychology. ASPPB has expressed that they may explore the possibility of creating a licensing examination specifically for master's level psychology. The Executive Director is going to collect more information and see if other states are in favor of this proposal and he will report back to the Advisory Committee.
